

VISION DISCOVERY AND BRAND DEVELOPMENT CASE

Daniel Bax had a near death experience that left him with half his brain crushed. The doctors said he would never walk, talk, eat solid food or remember anything from before the accident ever again. Daniel overcame all those challenges. He still has issues with memory and being able to manage life but that is why he has a support system of family and people around him. He also did work with Landmark to continue his personal development.

Daniel became an inspirational speaker and had a book published but he needed to be established as the authority in critical injury and brain trauma recovery. That is when his trustee approached me, Justin W. McMakin, about going from an idea to building a real brand; which we did.


First, I facilitated a discovery to define the context, purpose and results for his business vision. Daniel's resources and unique needs were also determined so that a creative strategy could be designed and executed to help him accomplish the results he wanted. My team and I were engaged to help execute the brand strategies for Daniel as well because we knew his vision intimately.



A simple action plan was budgeted in terms of timeline, money, and human resources that was then expanded into a strategic marketing plan and business development plan. His target audience niche was laser focused and it was clear that he needed brand awareness.

We ended up facilitating two new brands for him, Endless Potential and a community project called ACT NOW Awaken Canada Together. I facilitated a joint venture event with St. Michael's hospital and participated in a Heads Up Conference to bring brain injury awareness and holistic treatment. Through my efforts we were given an 8-minute spot on News at Noon with a major media channel, gained support from Justin Trudeau, and worked directly with Doctor Cusimano one of Canada's leading Neuro Surgeon's.
